

Resolution Supporting Littlerock Town Council

**To be proposed at the California LULAC
State Convention, May 23, 2010
SPONSORED BY DISTRICT 11**

WHEREAS, the Littlerock Town Council (LTC) representing the residents of an unincorporated area of the Antelope Valley in Los Angeles County has officially requested an investigation by the civil rights divisions of the FBI and the United States Department of Justice concerning the activities of the County Nuisance Abatement Team, which the Council charges as having cited approximately 25% of the residents of the area for purported county ordinance violations;

AND WHEREAS, the LTC has alleged that one example of the outrageous behavior of the Nuisance Abatement Team (NAT) is that an elderly, wheel chair bound woman was subjected to a search of her house pursuant to a search warrant for violations of zoning ordinances and that a gun was put to her head in the process;

AND WHEREAS, the LTC has alleged that the NAT engages in a pattern and practice of singling out the elderly for enforcement activities;

AND WHEREAS, the affidavits presented to the Los Angeles Superior Court in support of the issuance of search warrants by the NAT falsely claim that the LTC itself sought these enforcement actions when in fact the LTC is aware of no resolution or document purporting to seek these actions on its behalf;

AND WHEREAS, the LTC has officially resolved to request the assistance of California and National LULAC Civil Rights Commissions to investigate and provide redress for these alleged violations;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that CALIFORNIA LULAC supports the efforts of its Civil Rights Commission to assist the LTC;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT California LULAC calls upon the Civil Rights Divisions of the FBI and the US Department of Justice to investigate whether violations of 18 USC 241 and 242 have been committed by agents and employees of the County of Los Angeles operating under the auspices of the NAT.
